Anti-Slavery Statement for the Financial Year Ending on 31 December 2022

The Check Point group has zero tolerance towards modern slavery. Our group's Anti-Slavery Policy is available at Check Point's website and we encourage the reader to review it. This Statement should be read in conjunction with the Check Point Anti-Slavery Policy.

Within the past year, we have taken, inter alia, the following steps to ensure that slavery and human trafficking is not taking place in any of our supply chains and in any part of our business:

- a. We continue training and educating our relevant employees on our values and expectations from them and on appropriate due diligence exercises to be conducted on our supply chain partners.
- b. We conduct due diligence exercises on our relevant supply chain partners to identify and manage risks related to modern slavery and other risks associated with our supply chains.
- c. When we identify potential risks related to modern slavery with any of our suppliers, we are reviewing the forms of contracts we use with such suppliers to determine whether and where revisions to these contracts may be appropriate in order to combat modern slavery.

We recognize that combatting modern slavery and pursuing an ever-better ethical business conduct within the Check Point group and our supply chains is a long-term exercise that requires commitment and vision to ensure that our values are adhered to and implemented on a continuous basis. We will continue striving to advance and improve year after year.

This statement was approved by the Board of Directors of Check Point Software Technologies (UK) Ltd. on November 26, 2023, and covers also all the direct and indirect affiliates in the Check Point group, including the parent company, Check Point Software Technologies Ltd.
